

'What animals can we see on your cousin's farm?' asks Alice.


Grandpa is taking the children to his cousin Katy's farm in the hills.

'It was a lot of work. Most of the sheep are in the barn now,' he says, 'but some are up in the hills. It's snowing more and more. I'm scared.'





'I can help with my van,' says Grandpa.

'Please wait in the house, children,' he shouts.


But Clunk points at one of the hills.

Clunk goes up the hill and the children walk behind him. It isn't easy to walk on the snow, but they don't stop.






Clunk is fast. He moves the snow, and then ...


'Look!' says Alice. 'There are two lambs here too.'

The girls sit down with the lambs in their arms. Clunk has the mother sheep in his long arms.


'One, two, three ...' Ben runs and pushes the sled. 'Let's go!'
