

But when the van stops, the children can't see any snow.


'It's too hot for snow in these mountains,' says Grandpa.

The mountains are beautiful, but soon the children are hot and thirsty.





They meet a family on the path.

'It's the hottest summer here ever!' says Clunk.


Grandpa starts to go to the van again. 'I have a new idea!' he says. 'Let's go to some COLDER mountains!'

Soon the van is in a new place.



Ben watches it. 'Oh no!' he says.






The big snowball is fast. It picks up more and more snow, and it gets bigger and bigger.

At the top of the mountain, the children run to the van.


'Quick, Grandpa!' says Rosie. 'Let's help Clunk!'




Grandpa starts the van and drives down the mountain. The big snowball is very fast but Grandpa's fantastic van is a lot faster! It flies over the snow.




